

Hickster Projects is offering an artist's residency program, currently twice a year in July and September. The resident artist will have 24hr access to a private studio deep in the rural Crete Senesi area of Tuscany, famed for its light and exquisite desert like landscape. The studio (20 msq) has five skylights, and a glass floor to ceiling door, with diffuse LED lighting for working in the evenings, and an outside sink. It is therefore ideal for painters, and visual artists.

There is also an independent, one bedroom, extremely comfortable cottage (35msq) with all facilities provided. The residency is self-catering. Fast WiFi is available in both buildings. There is also access to a private art library. A small car is provided, to enable the resident to reach the nearby village and the local train station, where connections can be made to the fantastic national rail network of Italy, enabling visits to Siena, Rome, Florence and beyond. Residencies are normally one month in duration with selection being made by committee.

Expenses paid for by the artist:

- o Travel
- Supplies
- Food

The nearest Airports are Pisa, Rome and Florence with pick-up from the local train station, Asciano Monte Oliveto. The nearest village, San Giovanni d'Asso is 1.5kms away and has all local amenities.
